

Cedar View Park Enhancements

Nashua residents would like improvements to Cedar Valley Park to include a swimming pool complex, performance stage, and a larger area of improved public lake access. In order to provide more public shoreline access it would be necessary to relocate some existing campground sites further away from the waterfront as shown on the master plan. This would allow the existing campground road to serve as a lakeshore drive with parking and day use for activities such as picnicking and fishing, for many visitors and not just a few campers. It would also provide better room and opportunities for shoreline enhancements and stabilization measures.

REAP (Resource Enhancement and Protection) administered through the DNR, would be a viable source of funds for these improvements including a new recreation trail around the park. lowa's Statewide Transportation Alternatives Program administered through the DOT would be another potential funding source for the perimeter trail. Land and Water Conservation funds, also administered through the DNR, would provide potential funds for relocating the camping sites and help finance the swimming pool complex and performance stage.

Swimming pool construction will necessitate relocation of the skateboard park. The master plan shows a potential site.
